Events of Interest

The month of April was the month for Oswego Police Officers to participate in the bi-annual physical fitness standard test. Forty-five (45) officers took the test and thirty-seven (37) passed. The fastest time in the mile and a half run was achieved by Officer Lawrence with a time of 9:17. Great Job! The physical fitness test is given to officers to provide them with a “benchmark” of their physical fitness level. Often these types of tests can be a “wake up” call to them. In addition, in 2003 when the residents of Oswego were surveyed, 95% of the respondents felt that Oswego Police Officers should pass an annual physical fitness test. A similar survey in 2006 revealed that 98% of the respondents felt we should complete a physical fitness test.

Law of Interest

This month we again want to focus our attention for information on an issue that we are seeing more of with the warm weather. This issue is in regards to the growing use of devices that look similar to skateboards or scooters with handlebars, but with a motor to propel the device. The motors on these devices can be gas operated or electric. These “motorized scooters” appear to be growing in popularity in this area and officers are seeing children and adults riding them on the sidewalks and streets in the village.

We have consulted with the Kendall County States Attorney’s Office on this issue and these “motorized scooters” have been found to fit the classification of “motor scooters” and of “motorized vehicles” as defined by the Illinois Vehicle Code. As such, these “motorized scooters” and the operators of these are subject to the requirements that cover the operation of these devices. These requirements would include such things as a valid

driver’s license, obeying all traffic laws (stop signs, lane use, registration plates, turn signals, etc.), and having all required equipment on these devices that are required by the vehicle code.

The majority of the “motorized scooters” and their operators that we have been seeing do not meet the above requirements and are being ridden in an illegal manner. Any illegal operation is subject to being cited for those violations. We strongly discourage the use of these “motorized scooters” on any roadway, sidewalk, or public parking lot. We understand these items are being sold by many stores and on-line service companies but in general they are illegal to ride on any public roadway or sidewalk. They are also illegal on Oswegoland Park District trails, as the park ordinance prohibits motorized vehicles on the trail system.

Community Concerns

04/02 Received a concern for vehicles continuing to make U-turns at River Run Boulevard and Route 31. HOA President requested that we consider posting a No U-Turn for that area as the vehicles have damaged landscaping in the island repeatedly over the last two years and pose a hazard to motorists as they travel E/B on River Run Boulevard due to the hill. A recommendation for the No U-Turn will be forwarded to the Public Safety Committee for consideration at their May meeting based on the observations and measurements gathered.

04/15 A request came in for extra speed enforcement patrol on River Run Boulevard. This was added to the extra patrol list.

04/20 Received a concern about early morning construction starting in violation of the hours set in Southbury Subdivision. Reminders to patrol were put out regarding the special hours set in the Southbury Ordinance.

04/25 We received a request for additional speed enforcement on Kendall Point Drive between Route 34 and Belleview Circle. This was added to the extra patrol list and scheduled for SMART trailer use in May.

04/28 Received a request for additional speed enforcement on Mill Road between Orchard Road and Pineridge. This area was added to the extra patrol list.
