Month/Year: July 2008

In July 2008, we had 3,839 total police incidents as compared to July 2007 when we had 4,611.

Total police reports increased by 9.

Part 1 Crimes increased by 19 for the month and Part 2 Crimes increased by 10 compared to last July. The increase in Part 1 Crimes was due to thefts and burglaries.

We had 334 traffic citations as compared to 612 in July 2007. The largest decrease in citations issued was seatbelt citations. We feel that after a year-long grant motorists are using them more; therefore, a reduction in violators. At the same time, our traffic warnings increased to 986, up from 950. Our efforts are focused at trying to increase traffic safety, as we also saw a slight decrease in accidents for the month of July.

Total arrests increased by 2 for the month of July compared to 2007.

Overtime decreased by 72.5 hours for the month.

We took delivery of the 3 squad cars ordered in FY 07-08, they will be outfitted and placed into service in August. We will have two of the new squad cars run on E85 fuel and the other one on gasoline and you will see a chart monthly in my report outlining the comparison. Please review the chart and let me know if you would like any additional information.

Also, another new section was added to our monthly report which outlines our vehicle seizures. Again, please review this section and let me know if you have any questions.

A resident from the Churchill Club subdivision called to request extra speed enforcement on 5th Street in the area of Versailles. The resident advised they believed motorists exceed the posted speed limit of 35 mph on a regular basis. The S.M.A.R.T. Trailer was placed on 5th Street for a total of four days. During this time, the trailer recorded 6,625 vehicles. The average speed within the 85 percentile range was 39.5 mph. The maximum speed recorded during the study was 56 mph. 5th Street has been selected as a directed patrol location for the month of August.

I received a call from the resident at 411 Burr Oak Drive. They indicated that on a regular basis motorist exceed the posted speed limit of 25 mph. The resident was

concerned for the safety of the many young children who reside in the area. The resident requested extra patrol on Burr Oak Drive. As a means to determine whether a traffic safety issue existed on Burr Oak Drive, the S.M.A.R.T. Trailer was deployed to the area of 411 Burr Oak Drive for eight days. During this time, the trailer recorded a total of 712 vehicles. The average speed within the 85 percentile range was 22 mph. The maximum speed recorded during the study was 29 mph. During the eight days, only 15 vehicles exceeded the posted speed limit. As a means to support our speed study efforts and to determine if further enforcement efforts were necessary, members from our Citizens Police Academy Alumni (CPAA) completed a radar detail through the Citizen Assisted Radar Monitoring Program. On July 17th, CPAA members completed an hour long radar detail. During this time, they did not record any motorists traveling over the posted speed limit. Based on these measuring tools, it appears motorists are in compliance with the posted speed limit and that additional resources are not necessary on Burr Oak Drive at this time.

Continuing Extra Patrols

During the month of July we provided 21 hours and 15 minutes of dedicated extra patrol in 11 separate areas that resulted in 1 citation and 23 warnings for various offenses.

During the month of July, officers continued to pose as pedestrians in the downtown business district. A total of six details were completed at the intersection of Main and Washington Streets. The details are part of a campaign to educate motorists about the law requiring vehicles to stop for pedestrians in marked crosswalks. During the details, officers issued a warning or citation/ticket to those motorists who did not yield the right of way to the pedestrian(s). We will continue pedestrian crossing details throughout the summer and fall. Below are the results of our enforcement efforts in July.
