Community Concerns

03/15 A concern for speeding on River Run Boulevard was received. Extra patrol was conducted and no violations were observed.

03/16 A concern for speeding on Arboretum Way near Hedgerow was received. Extra patrol has begun in that area with no violation observed.

03/24 A concern for motorists violating the stop signs in front of the Dominick's and Target stores was received. Extra patrol has begun on this with no violations observed in the first 20 minutes that was conducted this month.

03/28 A concern for motorists not yielding to each other at the intersection of Berrywood and Pine Ridge Drive South was received. This area was monitored and we observed that since the previous western "stub" of Berrywood has now been extended and linked to the City of Yorkville to the west, that this uncontrolled intersection is receiving frequent use at the morning and evening peak travel periods. We will be presenting this intersection for two-way stop control to the Public Safety Committee at their next meeting in May.

03/29 A concern for motorists speeding on Fox Chase Drive North between Mill and Fawn Drive was received. No extra patrol was conducted on this street before the end of the month.

** During the month of March we provided 25 hours and 5 minutes of dedicated extra patrol in 19 different areas. This resulted in 18 citations and 26 written warnings being issued for various violations.
