Masonry Walls

A.L.L. Masonry continues to work on the exterior masonry walls and interior load bearing walls. Load bearing walls are those walls that steel supports will be resting on or connected to. Crews are working on the Northwest side of the building (training wing) and should finish up on the exterior walls next week.
